## BWAA, NWBW TO MERGE EFFECTIVE JAN. 1, 2007

By a vote of 31-19, Bowling Writers Association of America delegates to the annual convention in Las Vegas voted on June 26, to merge with the National Women Bowling Writers. The new organization, which retains BWAA as its name, becomes effective Jan. 1, 2007.

BWAA President Bill Vint announced that the joint task force members, led by BWAA chairman Lyle Zikes, explained to the Las Vegas attendees the reasons for the merger and the amendments to the original tentative document created at a meeting in June 2005 in Orlando. There was general agreement that all men and women who promote the sport and provide information for their readers should be in one organization. Vint added that those who had questions, or who were opposed to the unification, had ample opportunity to ask questions, make comments and generally receive a full understanding of the new organization.

NWBW and BWAA have voted to have eight members of their previous organizations serve as the first board of directors. They will elect officers for the first year. During next year's convention, new candidates will be able to challenge those elected to a one-year term.

The terms of office for board members will be Jan. 1 through Dec. 31, which also will become the organization's fiscal year.

Jerry Ramig of Clinton, Iowa, becomes BWAA president later this summer and will serve until Dec. 31, 2006. Steve James will continue as BWAA executive director until Dec. 31 when the new board will determine all new offices.

At the Columbia 300 writers' dinner at the host Hilton Hotel, the three previously announced award winners were honored—Carmen Salvino with the John O. Martino award; Al Matzelle with the Rip Van Winkle award, and Joe Gennaro with the Mort Lubly Sr. Hall of Fame award.

Next I'd like to thank president Bill Vint for the fine job he did conducting our business meetings. I thought the reports of the various committees, of which the majority were by e-mail and on our BWAA web site, were very productive.

My final thanks go to all of our sponsors during the convention. It was my first time attending Bowl Expo and I really enjoyed it. Who knows, maybe one of these years we can save a few dollars and do our whole convention by e-mail? But that would be no fun at all.

All the other reports were received during the meeting, with only a few minor changes that you can read in the minutes that appear in this newsletter.

The BWAA annual awards were presented during the various sponsored events during the week and those awards went to some very deserving bowling writers and industry giants. The names of all the winners are also listed in this newsletter.

One of my key jobs as president for the remainder of the year was to appoint the committees. During the meeting I talked with several chairmen and asked them if they would continue to serve, and they responded favorably. Also several committees will now be omitted since we will be operating with a different board in January and those leaders can determine what others are necessary. We will just have to wait and see. My appointments take us through Dec. 31 when many key votes must be completed.

The proposed committees that I did appoint are listed in another section of this report, and I have asked that the chairs add one or two members as they see fit. Anyone wishing to be on a committee should contact the chair.

Good luck to the new BWAA in January. I hope to see you all in Las Vegas again in 2007. We had 76 members registered, but we also had several members who could not make it this year due to illness or (Continued on Page 2)



## BWAA'S BOWL EXPO AUCTION NETS \$1,690 FOR SCHOLARSHIPS

BWAA's "silent auction" is becoming an International Bowl Expo fixture, and an excellent revenue source for the BWAA Chuck Pezzano Scholarship Fund.

This year's third annual auction brought in \$1,690, \$80 more than last year. A significant portion of the money was from purchases of items donated by the late Bud Fisher, accounting for \$945 of the total.

Since January, BWAA has added \$2,250 to its scholarship fund, including a \$300 contribution from the Metropolitan Bowling Writers. Individual contributions plus the auction add up to more money for the fund than we actually paid out this year (\$2,000).

With a healthy scholarship fund residing in the SMART program, BWAA voted in June to allow the scholarship committee to award "up to three" \$1,000 scholarships next year. The program will be reviewed on an annual basis to see if more scholarships and/or more money can be awarded, based upon the financial health of the account.

## BWAA COLLEGIATE POLLS BASED ON "CERTIFIED" RESULTS

Why are some of the nation's most powerful women's collegiate teams not listed on BWAA's Collegiate Polls? Because BWAA uses statistics from tournaments that are USBC Collegiate certified, notes committee chairman Steve Lawson.

"Some NCAA teams bowl only in NCAA exclusive tournaments that are not USBC Collegiate Certified (or if they are certified, the results are not being forwarded to USBC Collegiate for inclusion in the stats package that goes out to our voters). Some teams bowl NCAA exclusive events, but also compete in USBC-certified tournaments that are open to all women's teams....so their results will show up in the statistics we send to our panelists," Lawson said.

"Unfortunately, this is one of the areas of confusion as some schools migrate to NCAA-exclusive competition while the others bowl in USBC Collegiate certified tournaments as they always have and make the progression by qualifying for sectionals to advance to the USBC Intercollegiate Team Championships. It has become a real mess to report on and keep straight, that's for sure."

Annual Membership Meeting, June 26 – 27, 2006

Hilton Hotel, Las Vegas, Nevada

The meeting was called to order at 9:40 a.m., Monday, June 26, by President Bill Vint.

Keynote Speaker, PBA President Fred Schreyer (moved up on the agenda). Fred talked to the group about the status and future of the PBA and answered questions.

#### Welcome and Introductions

President Vint appointed Benny Frisella to act as Sergeant-at-Arms in the absence of Darlene Pierce and Jackie Wyckoff to act as recording secretary in the absence of Steve James, BWAA Executive Director.

Registration Report – 76 members registered, 45 present for a quorum.

Memorial tribute by Chuck Pezzano for Bud Fisher, Ray Gray and Chris Schenkel

*Morning break 10:35 – 10:45 a.m.*

Presentation by the merger task force led by Lyle Zikes. Speakers: Nancy Chapman, Barbara Spencer, Mike Hennessy, Hazel McLeary, Jackie Wyckoff, Bill Vint. Zikes recommended adopting the new organization bylaws (motion from committee, no second required). Zikes then opened the floor for comments and questions. Respondents, pro and con, were: Dick Evans, Mark Miller, Joan Feinblum, Dan McDonough, Sam Vasta, Jim Goodwin, Mike Anderson.

*lunch break 12:15 – 2:00 p.m.*

Discussion resumed on adoption of bylaws. Respondents, pro and con, were: Dan McDonough, Nancy Chapman, Craig Matthews, Mark Miller, Dick Evans, Jim Goodwin, Pearl Keller.

Jim Goodwin moved to have a mail vote by all BWAA members on the adoption of the new organization bylaws. After some discussion it was determined that there was a motion already on the floor to be voted on first. There was no second to Goodwin's motion. Hazel McLeary called for the question.

Registration Chair Glenda Millar reported 50 members present and eligible to vote. A ballot vote was taken. 50 votes cast / 31 yes / 19 no. By the action of the members present the new organization bylaws were adopted. The new organization will become active on January 1, 2007.

John Falzone moved to destroy the ballots, Frank Weiler second, approved.

#### Action on the Minutes of the 2005 Annual Meeting:

Joyce Letourneau requested removal of the sentence "*She also suggested that there be a definite time period when the executive director should be paid, and the executive committee will take that under advisement and inform James as to when he should be paid*" from the 2005 minutes. Joan Taylor moved to accept the minutes as amended, Craig Matthews second, approved.

#### Committee Reports

President Vint asked if there were any comments or questions on the written reports which were previously mailed/mailed to members and posted on the BWAA bowlingwriters.com website. Hearing none, Joan Feinblum moved to accept the reports as written, Jerry Ramig second, approved.

Andrea Matthews moved to approve the BWAA Code of Ethics as prepared by the Committee, Mark Miller second, approved. Elaine Hagin moved to remove the second bullet from the code, John Falzone second, approved. The BWAA Code of Ethics shall read:

As BWAA members we pledge

- To represent the interests of the organization and abide by its rules and conditions.
- To promote the ideas and goals of the BWAA and practice the highest levels of professionalism.

Proposal #1 – Revise the Amateur Bowler of the Year Award (withdrawn by proposer)

Proposal #2 – Revise the Audit Committee Procedure Lyle Zikes moved to accept the proposal, Pete Fedynich second, approved (*adopted for the 2006 BWAA audit*).

Article 5. MANAGEMENT, Paragraph B. Audit changed to read:

The BWAA financial statement, including all records, shall be presented to the audit committee by the executive director no later than 90 days after the end of the previous fiscal year. After the committee has audited the records, it shall distribute a printed copy of the financial statement, together with whatever recommendation it might have, to the membership.

Proposal #3 – add to President's Duties. The elected BWAA President shall have the authority to appoint committees, chairmen of the committees and members of the committees. However, the President must communicate with the current chairman of an existing committee before adding or removing any member of the committee, including the chairman. The Legislative committee recommended rejection, Joan Feinblum second, rejected.

Proposal #4 - Discussion on recommendation from Board of Directors meeting. John Falzone moved to adopt the policy that ballots for voting on all BWAA awards use the same weighted values of 5/2/1 points for first, second and third place votes and the results will be submitted to the Executive Director, Joan Feinblum second, approved.

Web site – Bill Vint reported more training is needed for James to help to keep the site current.

BWAA Scholarship Funds report is correct.

Committee recommends getting a BWAA credit card for expenses of the Executive Director.

Committee recommends salary of the Executive Director be based on the calendar year and paid in six month increments.

The committee moved that the financial statements be placed on file as amended and approval of the two additional recommendations. Approved.

Website – Discussion on membership information to be posted on the website for public viewing. Agnes Duffy moved to allow each member to decide what contact and/or personal information would be posted on the website, Frank Weiler second, approved.

Mike Hennessy moved to meet at BowlExpo, Frenchy Letourneau second, approved.

Mike Hennessy moved to recommend the name Bowling Writers Association of America as the name of the new merged organization, Dick Evans second, approved. Note: This is a recommendation for the new board ONLY. The new bylaws provide that the board will decide the name of the organization.

Nominations for eight new merged board members. Recommendations from Nominating Committee Mike Hennessy, Fran Deken, Hazel McLeary, Dick Evans & Chuck Pezzano were (listed in alphabetical order): Tom Clark, Dick Evans, Jim Goodwin, Mike Hennessy, Craig Matthews, Jerry Ramig, Bill Vint, Lyle Zikes. Joan Feinblum nominated John Falzone from the floor. Vote was by written ballot and with members voting for up to eight nominees. The top four vote getters will serve a two-year term and the second four vote getters will serve a one-year term.

Registration chairman Glenda Millar reported 40 members present and eligible to vote. Election Results: 39 ballots cast, 37 Lyle Zikes, 36 Bill Vint & Mike Hennessy, 34 Jim Goodwin & Tom Clark, 32 John Falzone, 30 Dick Evans, 37 Craig Matthews, 24 Jerry Ramig. Mike Hennessy requested to serve a one-year term to avoid a run-off between Clark and Goodwin, approved. Two-year term board members: Zikes, Vint, Goodwin, Clark. One-year term: Hennessy, Falzone, Evans, Matthews.

Fran Deken moved to destroy the ballots, Barbara Spencer second, approved.

Mike Hennessy reported that the Board of Governors met and would like to place the name of Fran Deken into consideration as the Chairman of the new Council of Life Members. Nancy Chapman will solicit NNBW members for a name for consideration from NNBW's side. Life members from both organizations will vote to select the Council of Life Members chair from between the NNBW and BWAA candidates.

Chuck Pezzano moved to donate \$200 from the general fund to the Eddie Elias fund in the name of Bud Fisher, Pete Fedynich second, approved.

Agnes Duffy moved to donate \$500 from the general fund

to the IBMHF, Elaine Hagin second, approved.

Dick Evans moved to donate \$500 to the BVL Fund for Bowling Carpet Kits for the Troops, Elaine Hagin second, approved.

- Appointment of a new committee. Three BWAA members have been appointed to a newly formed Task Force under STE. The three appointees are Jim Goodwin, Jim Dressel and Jerry Ramig.

Frank Weiler moved to authorize the officers and executive director to dissolve the business of the BWAA and transfer funds to the new organization, Benny Frisella second, approved.
